Code of Practice: General Information

St Felix School (Southwold) Swimming Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that the swimmers, coaches, and parents associated with the club should always show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be always open and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about the club with the Director of Swimming.

Please find below a code of practice for swimmers (aged over 18 years and non-pupils) which you are expected to always abide by.

Failure to abide by the appropriate code of practice could result in action being taken.

Code of Practice for Swimmers

The essence of good ethical conduct and practice is summarised below. All swimmers must:

- Athletes representing St Felix School (Southwold) Swimming Club agree to abide by the rules of conduct set by FINA and Swim England in relation to the governance of the sport. This includes all codes set forth in relation to doping.
- Athletes must go through HR checks including DBS through St Felix School (Southwold) Swimming Club.
- Athletes must read and adhere to all policies outlined by Saint Felix School and read the latest version of the Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) and the School Safeguarding Policy.
- Athletes must adhere to all direct instructions from St Felix coaching staff regarding Health and Safety policies and the expected behaviour and standards as part of Saint Felix School.
- Athletes must use separate changing rooms and toilet facilities to Saint Felix School students.
- Athletes training with the team will not be engage in any type of romantic relationships of any kind (including physical and non-physical) with any current Saint Felix School student during their membership.
- Athletes must discuss and agree their training schedules and plans for each training cycle.
- Athletes found to be in breach of the common rule of law, specifically drink driving offences, supply or sharing of alcohol/cigarettes/vapes/drugs to students will be asked to leave the swimming club with immediate effect.

Failure to comply on the above will lead to the athlete being asked to leave the club immediately and matters of this nature have the potential to severely damage the reputation of the team.
